Overview in brief

Anyone who wants to tow trailers on public roads needs to pass the Driver and Vehicle Standards Agency's (DVSA) test.

Our course covers everything you'll need to be ready for that test.

A maximum of just two people can attend the course at any one time.

The finer details

We'll take you through all the aspects of the trailer test.



You'll learn pre-driving checks, key safety issues and the ins and outs of the test itself.

You'll also gain plenty of coupling/uncoupling experience and then driving with the trailer attached.



Course sessions:

- Driving licence and eyesight check
- Vehicle/trailer checks – on-road
- Coupling and uncoupling procedures
- Car and trailer 'show me/tell me' vehicle safety questions
- Test trailer manoeuvre
- On-road driving including independent drive
- Test centre procedures
- Feedback.

What will be covered?

By the end of the course, you'll be able to:

- Understand the requirements of the B+E driving test
- Appreciate the standards of driving required to pass the driving element of the test through practice in a variety of road conditions similar to those likely to be used on test
- Couple/uncouple the trailer to/from a vehicle following test standard procedures
- Practise at reversing the vehicle and trailer (unit) within the dimensions required for the test and appreciate the standards required to pass the manoeuvring element
- Understand the vehicle, trailer and loading criteria for the test
- Receive feedback on performance.
